

NOMINATIONS FOR DISTRICT GOVERNOR 2025-2026

Michael Chaffee - DG 22-2023 -----



Each year we call upon our clubs to explore with the members of their club the opportunity to serve as district governor.

District 6330 selects a district governor by nominating committee.

Nominations for district governor to serve during the Rotary year 2025-2026 are now being accepted until October 15, 2022

Members in good standing who are willing and able to serve as district governor and have served as Club President are eligible to be nominated. Qualifications and responsibilities of the Governor-Nominee as outlined in the 2019 Manual of Procedure Article 16.010 Qualifications of a Governor Nominee are:

Qualifications of a Governor-nominee.

UNLESS EXCUSED BY THE BOARD, THE PERSON SELECTED AS A GOVERNOR-NOMINEE SHALL AT THE TIME OF SELECTION:

- (a) be a member in good standing of a functioning club in the district;
- (b) have served as club president for a full term or as charter president for at least six months;
- (c) demonstrate willingness, commitment, and ability to fulfill the duties and responsibilities of a governor in section 16.030.;
- (d) demonstrate knowledge of the qualifications, duties, and responsibilities of governor as prescribed in the bylaws; and
- (e) submit to RI a statement that the Rotarian understands those qualifications, duties, and responsibilities, is qualified for the office of governor, and is willing and able to assume and faithfully perform those duties and responsibilities.

Nominations must also include a resolution adopted by your Rotary Club at a regular meeting naming the nominated candidate. The resolution must be signed by the Club Secretary and the club can only nominate one of its own members. The 2019 Manual of Procedure, Article 12 Nominations and Elections for Governors – section 12.030.3 Clubs Suggestions for Governor states: The governor shall invite clubs to submit their suggestions for nominations for governor. The deadline for suggestions is at least two months before the nominating committee meeting. The suggestions shall be submitted by a resolution naming the suggested candidate adopted at a regular club meeting and certified by the secretary. A club shall only suggest one of its own members.







A Trinidad & Tobago son of the soil is breaking barriers across the Rotary world. Encouraging and fostering the Ideal of Service as a basis of worthy enterprise, Canada's Rotary fraternity is set to embrace District 7030 Past Assistant Governor, Kenneth Boodhu



The Caribbean is renowned for its sparkling beaches, unbelievable blue waters, Soca/calypso music, limbo dancers and laidback lifestyles. And it is also amongst these Islands In The Sun that District 7030 in Zone 34 comes alive in The World of Rotary. The Rotary Club of Global Passport in our own District 6330 has welcomed its first Caribbean member

Rotarian **KENNETH** "**KEN**" **BOODHU** hails from the twin island state of Trinidad & Tobago. Well known for its famous Carnival the islands sit just north of the Republic of Venezuela. Also known around the World as The West Indies, District 7030 stretches from the island state of St Kitts/Nevis in the Caribbean Sea, working its way southward to include St Lucia, Antigua, Dominica, Barbados, St Vincent, Grenada, Trinidad & Tobago, continuing to the South American Coastline to include Guyana, Suriname, and French Guiana. This Rotary diaspora also takes in Martinique, Guadeloupe, and the Dutch grouping islands of Aruba, Curacao, and Bonaire. Here we have the most diverse District in the Rotary World, and where at a District Conference you converse in English, French and Dutch.

KEN started his Service to Community at The Rotary Club of Sangre Grande in 2006. He served as President on three occasions before transferring to The Rotary Club of Arima, an area where he currently resides with his Partner in Service, Indra, and two sons, Rajiv and Sanjiv. The younger of the siblings, Sanjiv, is Secretary of the Rotary Club of St Augustine. At Arima, Ken also had the distinction of serving as Club President.

During the Covid crisis, with Rotary activity almost at a standstill throughout the island, Ken discovered Global Passport online and a new exciting Rotary challenge beckoned. Within a short space of time, he was invited to become an Honorary member of the club. There was to be no turning back, and Ken was admitted to full membership in February of this year. Today he is delighted to be recently nominated as President Elect of Global Passport for 2023/24.

In the wider field of Rotary, Ken was appointed as Assistant Governor in District 7030 during the years 2014/15 and 2015/16. Additionally In 2019, 2020 and 2021 he served as District 7030 Rotary International Conference Promotions Chair, Houston /Texas Convention being the last port of call.

In addition to his Rotary calling, Ken has served on several Trinidad &Tobago Government School Boards, stints at the Ministry of Social Welfare, headed Chambers of Commerce entities on numerous occasions and is well known throughout the Caribbean for his involvement as an actor in several international movies and Television productions. As a stage actor he has over one thousand performances to his credit, initially entering the field of drama at Queens Royal College in Port of Spain, and spanning a 50-year period, including appearances in United States of America.



The Rotary Club has now shipped over 12,000 AquaBoxes since the project began in 2006.

The two pail two filter AquaBox system can supply a family of four with clean water for about a year, greatly helping disaster survivors to recover and put their lives back together.

Dennis Dinsmore

District Webmaster

Rotarian Dennis Dinsmore is returning to his old job as our District Webmaster some 18 years after starting the district Clubrunner site in 2004. He has also served as webmaster for our Zone 24 as well as for his home club, Genesee Valley.

Dennis is a familiar face to many Rotarians, having served as District Governor in 2005-06, and later as Rotary District Foundation Chair then as the Council on Legislation rep two 3-year terms. From 2012 to 2015 he served as the Regional Rotary Foundation Chair for Zone 24 working with 17 Rotary districts across Canada, US, Bermuda, France and Russia. He is a Major Donor to the Rotary Foundation and is the recipient of the foundation's Citation for Meritorious Service.

His passion in Rotary is to support our Foundation in its efforts to eradicate polio. As a child, he was one of thousands of "Polio Pioneers" who were lucky enough to have received the first Salk polio vaccine in 1954. Some of his childhood friends who were permanently scarred by polio then and some Rotary friends who suffer from post-polio syndrome today were not so lucky and he feels he owes it to them to make our world polio free.

Dennis holds a Bachelor's degree in engineering as well as a Master's degree in business administration. He worked for many years as a hospital administrator before later founding The Dinsmore Group, Inc. a firm that developed custom software for the healthcare industry. Dennis and his wife Eileen, now both retired, have two children and four grandchildren.





Dr. Stephanie Urchick is a member of the Rotary Club of McMurray, Pennsylvania and has served Rotary as an RI Director and Chair of the Board's Executive Committee, a Foundation Trustee, Chair of the Rotary Strategic Planning and TRF Centennial Celebration Committees, member of the Atlanta RI Convention Committee, RLTI Moderator, International Training Leader, Regional Foundation Coordinator, President's Representative, District Governor, District Delegate and Member-at-Large for three Councils on Legislation, and as a member of various RI Committees and in many club, district, and Zone roles.

A Rotarian since 1991, Stephanie has participated in a variety of international service projects, including National Immunization Days (polio prevention) in India and Nigeria, the building of an elementary school in Vietnam, water filter installation in the Dominican Republic, and mentoring new Rotarians in Ukraine. Securing mammography equipment and a biopsy unit for a hospital in Poland was the district-wide TRF matching grant that Stephanie coordinated with the Rotary Club of Krakow. In its commemorative book, the Rotary Club of Krakow noted Stephanie Urchick as one of the agents helping the re-birth of Rotary in post-Communist Poland. Currently, Stephanie is helping to partner clubs and districts in the U.S. with Rotary clubs in Kosovo and Albania for humanitarian and educational services.

Stephanie's professional background is in the higher education, consulting, and entertainment industries. She received her doctorate degree in Leadership Studies from Indiana University of Pennsylvania and has been recognized and awarded by The Rotary Foundation and numerous community and international organizations.

He is passionate about growing Rotary Membership through forming new and innovative Rotary, Rotaract and satellite clubs. He founded, co-founded, helped form and/or inspired dozens of new and creative clubs around the world including:

- The first ever Rotary Club in the world to serve veterans;
- The first ever Rotary Club in the world focused on ending human trafficking;
- The Rotary Club of Network for Empowering Women, which was featured in the North American Rotary Magazine;
- The Rotaract eClub for the Environment - the first ever causebased, international, Rotaract eClub focusing on the environment, which was mention by Rotary CEO John Hugo in his closing remarks at the 2021 Rotary International Convention;



- The Rotary Club of Global Travelers, which was featured in the North American Rotary Magazine;
- The Kaleidoscope Rotaract Club, to serve those with Autism and their families, which he is a member of; and The Minnesota Pride Rotary Club

Tom was one of only 20 North American Rotary leaders selected by Rotary International Past President Mark Maloney and Rotary International Membership Staff to participate in a New Club Development Summit and was subsequently named as a Zone 29 Innovative Club Advocate. Tom is also one of only 500 Rotarians in the world to be named to The Membership Society for New Member Sponsors for bringing in more than 50 active members into his club, which puts him at the Gold Level of the Society. He was the winner of 2021 "Zones 28 and 32 Individual Membership Innovation Award," for promoting new cause-based clubs throughout the world.

Tom now inspires others around the world and helps them form their own new and innovative Rotary clubs. He speaks regularly on the topic of membership at Rotary club, district, multi-district, zone and international events. He spoke at this year's Rotary International Assembly and for the past few years has led and been a speaker on breakout session panels and workshops at Rotary International Conventions. He is on the PETS Alliance's list of "Popular Speakers" and recently served as a President's Representative to a district in the Philippines.


